## **RE-INTEGRATION (2024)- Mr.MAHESH**



On January 9, 2024, Mr. Mahesh was taken into our shelter by police officers after they had saved him at the Poonamalle bus stop. We had to bathe and groom him after finding him with filthy clothes and a nasty beard. In addition, he received counselling and medical support. He was insistent that he wouldn't cooperate when the session first started, but the therapist worked incredibly hard to assist him. Changes came gradually, and he also spent most of his time exercising, dancing, and walking. He revealed the identities of his family members during a good counselling session, and in order to reintegrate him, we had to notify Tambaram Police Station on January 30, 2024. The parents were called and given the necessary counseling. We got to learn from the parents that he goes to work in his village. Mr. Mahesh's family reached our shelter home on January 31, 2024, and with gratitude, they received him.

## **RE-INTEGRATION (2024)- Mr.VIMAL RAJ**



On January 3, 2024, Vimal Raj (20/M) got admitted to our shelter home after being rescued from K3 Aminjikarai Police Station. In the evening, around 5 p.m., we got a call from Aminjikarai Police Station saying that they had the family of the boy. So, his sister, Mrs. Prashanthini, came around 8 o'clock in the evening to take him home. HOPE TRUST collected and verified the necessary documents and reintegrated Vimal Raj.

## **RE-INTEGRATION (2024)- BALASUBRAMANIAM**



Balasubramaniam reintegrated with his family on December 18, 2023. He was accepted on August 15, 2023, into our Hope Shelter. He was pretty erratic at first touching people without cause, and extremely hyperactive. He began to progressively change and respond effectively after receiving ongoing therapy and counselling. Once he was trusted, he gave his mother's phone number. After confirming the paperwork with his mother Hemalatha, Hope Trust reintegrated him.

## RE-INTEGRATION (2024) - ARAVIND RAM



Aravind Ram reintegrated with his family on December 2023. He was admitted on August 6, 2023, into our Hope Shelter. He was pretty erratic at first, touching people without cause, and extremely hyperactive. He began to progressively change and respond effectively after receiving ongoing therapy and counselling. Once he was trusted, he gave his father's phone number. After verifying the documents with his father and mother, Hope Trust reintegrated him.

## **RE-INTEGRATION (2024) - Mr. VICKY**



Mr. VICKY (SUNNEER) was rescued by ICF (K7Police Station) with the help of Karunai Ullangal and got admitted to our shelter for further treatment and also for basic needs such as food, clothes, an shelter. Initially, he wouldn't talk to anyone, respond to anyone, or cooperate with anyone. All he does is stay quiet, shout, or hold someone so tight when he gets angry. Self-care was also very poor. The staff's had a tough time initially, but gradually he built a good friendship with the staff and started to talk and share about his family. Later, we found his parents, whose father is a farmer, and reintegrated him.

# SPEECH THERAPY TESTIMONIES – 2024

I am S. Tharunesh from Poonamelle Hope EIC Autism Center. I initially understood and expressed in 2-word utterance and also comprehended 'Wh' questions like what, who, where and why. I was having a lot of trouble communicating in three- to four- word sentences. I made an effort to interact with my peer groups as well, but all I could manage was a single phrase. Speech therapy was implemented for me. My therapist planned a goal for me in such a way that I will be able to speak in 3 to 4 word utterance.

Even though I initially had trouble understanding, I did my best. My therapist skillfully led me through several exercises and activities aimed at enhancing my language abilities and boosting my self-assurance. It started with simple sounds and gestures followed by words. After that, my speech therapist moved on to story narration and topics wise narration.

I can now speak in three to four word sentences without prompt, present my ideas more clearly, and interact with my peers in acceptable three to four word sentences under the right circumstances.


## **SPECIAL EDUCATION TESTIMONIES - 2024**

Her dressing sense was poor, but today she has learned to read, write, respond, and dress well. Today, she also learned to colour pictures correctly. Play instruments like the guitar. 
# **SPECIAL EDUCATION TESTIMONIES - 2024**


## **SPECIAL EDUCATION TESTIMONIES - 2024**
